School Improvement Plan Goals 2018 - 19

Goal 1

To improve student knowledge and skills in reading and math as measured by student performance on the Smarter Balanced Assessment. There will be at least 10% increase in the number of students meeting standard in reading and math in grades 3-5.

Goal 2

To improve student knowledge and skills in reading and math as measured by student performance on the Smarter Balanced Assessment. There will be at least 10% increase in the number of students meeting standard in reading and math in the special population subgroups (i.e. ELL, Low Income, Special Education, and Title I) in grades 3-5.

Goal 3

To improve building-wide attendance to achieve a goal of at least 90% of the student body present and on time each day.

As of October 1, 2018, 4623 students were enrolled in the school district and 419 students were enrolled at Stanwood Elementary. The student count for October 1, 2017 was 455. The student gender percentages for October 2017 were 53.6% male and 46.4% female.

About Our School Building

Stanwood Elementary School was built in 1956 on an 11.9 acre site that is located in West Stanwood. It was remodeled in 1990, with further more recent changes, including a new roof, a new playground, a new boiler and remodeled bathrooms.

There are 21 classrooms, a library, gymnasium, computer lab, music room, resource room, and two Title 1 rooms. Our total building size is 52,071 square feet. Our facilities are used often by a variety of community, including SCJAA, AAU, Stanwood-Camano Little League, Stanwood Camano Youth Soccer Club and Strategic Chess.

The Stanwood-Camano School District uses a variety of assessment measures to develop a profile of what students know and are able to do. These profiles are used to monitor and report student progress in meeting the Washington State Learning Standards (WSLS). The Smarter Balance (SBA) assesses student knowledge in two core subject areas (Math and English Language Arts). To measure science, we use the Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). These assessments use a combination of multiple-choice and short answer responses. The tests are administered to students in grades three through eight, ten and eleven. Not every grade level is tested in the same subject areas. The scores below indicate the percentage of students who met or exceeded the state standard on the SBA the WCAS for science.

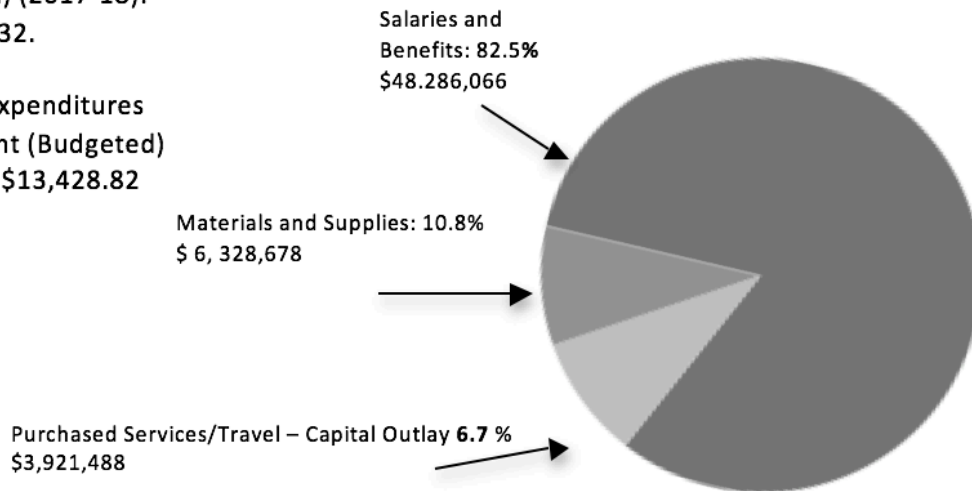
The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)
